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1. Introduction

1.1 Open space survey design and distribution

1.1.1 Survey purpose

This survey was prepared as the main method of seeking community input during the background research and analysis phase of the City of Whittlesea Open Space Strategy. The intent of the survey is to gain an understanding of what people value about open space, existing patterns of use and key issues that the community would like addressed in open space. The surveys included questions about both resident and worker use of open space.

The survey distribution and reporting on the outcomes focus on the established areas within the municipality. The extent of the established areas is described in 1.1.3 below.

1.1.2 Survey design

The survey included a combination of multiple choice and long hand questions that can be completed within 5 to 10 minutes. The survey included photos of different types of open space in the City of Whittlesea, and provided a brief background as to what an Open Space Strategy is and the reasons for its preparation.

A copy of the survey is attached to this report as Appendix A.

1.1.3 Survey distribution

The survey was distributed and available as both a hard copy and online survey. Translated copies of the survey were uploaded onto Council's Community Voice Website in Arabic, Chinese, Croatian, Greek, Italian, Macedonian, Turkish and Vietnamese.

Printed surveys were distributed in August 2013 via the walker network to 38,100 properties in established areas including:

- Bundoora (within the City of Whittlesea)
- Epping (up to Findon Road)
- Lalor
- Mill Park
- South Morang (up to McDonalds Road)
- Thomastown
- Whittlesea Township

Additionally, 2,500 were mailed to businesses in the established areas to gain feedback from workers as well as residents in the municipality. 200 printed surveys were distributed to the industrial precincts and Thomastown. 50 surveys were distributed to community groups and organisations including educational activities, senior groups, multicultural groups, sporting clubs, environmental organisations, etc. 1,020 printed surveys were distributed to residents/land owners in Rural North. In total 41,720 hard copies were distributed.

The survey was advertised and/or featured in the Whittlesea Leader, The Northern Weekly, Staff Matters Weekly, Council's Corporate News and Whittlserene. In addition posters and flyers were displayed within Council offices and municipal libraries.

The surveys were available for completion and return by 15 September 2013 and they were received for data entry up to 2 October 2013. The online survey closed on 28 September 2013. A combined total of 630 completed surveys were received, with 436 hard copy surveys completed and mailed back to the City of Whittlesea and a total of 194 surveys completed online. This represents approximately 1.5 per cent of the total number distributed.

Entry into a draw to win an iPad mini was offered as an incentive to all who completed and returned the survey. The prize was drawn by the Mayor and awarded to the winner on 15 October 2013.

Please refer to Appendix C for the assumptions made during the data entry process.

Surveys were received from all areas of the City of Whittlesea and these have been assessed collectively in the Municipal Wide section of this report. The

percentage of returned surveys from Bundoora, Mill Park, Whittlesea and Rural North areas were slightly over represented when compared to the percentage of the total population of City of Whittlesea living in these precincts. The percentage of returned surveys from Blossom Park, Epping, Lalor, South Morang and Thomastown were slightly under represented as a proportion of the total population and Growth Areas. All precincts have also been assessed individually to inform the strategy at the precinct level. Refer to Section 3 of this report.

1.2 Overall summary of the open space survey outcomes

1.2.1 Summary of residents' responses

The top three values for open space are:

- To relax and unwind (72%)
- Place for children to play (63%)
- Trees (62%)

The three most popular open spaces visited within walking distance are:

- Redleap Recreation Reserve (10%)
- Ancillary open space including shopping plazas, local streets and school grounds, etc (8%)
- Mill Park Recreation Reserve (5%)
- Norris Bank Parklands (4%)

Further than walking distance, the most popular open spaces are:

- Bundoora Park (8%)
- Yan Yean Reservoir Park (8%)
- Other open space outside the Municipality (6%)

The key information this is telling us is that people are travelling outside the city to regularly visit open space, and based on reviewing the reasons for them doing this, it relates to the diversity of facilities, activities and character offered in other open spaces, along with it being convenient.

Top three reasons for visiting open space within walking distance:

- Access close by (25%)
- Walking (19%)
- Play (17%)

Top three reasons for visiting open space beyond walking distance:

- Walking (8%)
- Play (7%)
- Barbecues (5%)

For open space nearby, suggested improvements include:

- Regular maintenance (7%)
- More public toilets (7%)

- Improvements to playgrounds including increasing diversity of them (4%)
- Provide more seating (4%)

Lack of time is the main reason people give for not visiting open space, followed by it being too far to travel. People specifically nominate Plenty George Park as an open space they do not use.

On a regular basis (daily and weekly) local streets for exercise are the most frequently used areas followed by small local parks. The low daily usage of regional and major parklands suggests that they do not serve the local needs and when analysing the responses to the question about open spaces not used, distance to travel is a key reason they don't use some open spaces. The waterway corridors are not well used which may reflect the difficulties associated with easily accessing them.

The most frequently used facilities include:

- Walking paths (82%)
- Seating (66%)
- Open grassed areas for informal use (62%)
- Playgrounds and playspaces (60%)

1.2.2 Summary of workers responses

Approximately 33 per cent of respondents who completed the survey nominated they also work in the City of Whittlesea. Of the people who work in the City of Whittlesea, 62 per cent said they use open space near their workplace.

The most common reasons for visiting open space near their workplace are:

- Being outdoors as a break from work
- · To exercise and keep fit
- Cycling/jogging/walking too and from work

1.2.3 Summary of general comments

The long answer questions from the survey are summarised and entered into the database as summary statements. Following is a summary of the key issues raised in the surveys prepared by the person reviewing all the long hand answers.

- Public toilets, provide more (23)
- Exercising dogs in open space (20)
- Additional open space required (17)
- Improve multi-use of open space (14)
- Additional open space required as densities increase (10)
- Maintenance regular maintenance and/or cleaning of open space (13)
- Rubbish and litter in open space, including broken glass, is a concern to residents (13)

2. Municipal-wide summary

Number of respondents

630 respondents completed the survey. 571 indicated that they live in the City of Whittlesea and 59 of respondents indicated they only work and don't live in the municipality. The survey was designed such that the workers only answered questions related to open space near their workplace. These are summarised in Section 2.8 of this report. All other questions were answered by those living in the City of Whittlesea (571).

2.1 Values of open space

Respondents were asked to indicate what they valued most about the open space in their municipality and were invited to select any of the twenty-three values listed, with an option to add additional values under the 'other' category.

Percentages are calculated on the basis of the total number of residents, 571. The table below illustrates the information, listing the twenty-three values in priority order.

Open space in the City of Whittlesea is most valued by respondents as a place to relax and unwind, closely followed by a place for children to play, and trees. More than 50 per cent of residents consider open space an important habitat for native plants and animals and for their health and wellbeing.

2.4 Open space not visited

This question was asked to find out what issues currently limit the use of existing open space by residents. The question included some of the common reasons why people may not use open space. The reasons can apply either to a specific open space or more broadly to open space in general.

The question has been analysed below in 3 parts:

Part One – whether there is open space they would like to visit but are unable to.

Part Two – the reasons they are unable to visit open space.

Part Three – specific open spaces they are unable to visit.


The percentages nominated in Part One are a proportion of the total of 571 surveys. The percentages nominated in Part Two are a percentage of respondents who answered yes to the first part of the question (183).

2.4.1 Is there open space you would like to visit but are unable to?



The following pie chart illustrates the percentage of respondents who answered yes to this question as a proportion of all 571 respondents. 32 per cent of respondents indicated that they would like to visit open space but are unable to.

2.4.2 The reasons why you are unable to visit open space:



The most frequent reason for not visiting open space was lack of time at 48 per cent. This was followed by the reason that open space is too far to travel at 41 per cent. Personal safety and open space being too remote with a lack of people

around were also important factors with 25 per cent or more of respondents indicating this.

The lack of time and distance too far combined with other reasons and general comments indicate that improving the quality of open space and ensuring it maximises its appeal to the community who live nearby may encourage higher levels of use.

34 per cent of respondents selected the 'other' category and listed other reasons they don't visit open space generally, or a specific open space.

Local streets for exercise and small local parks are the most commonly and frequently used type of open space by City of Whittlesea residents.

On a monthly and annual basis major regional parklands and large parks and gardens are the most commonly visited type of open space.

Overall, sporting reserves receive comparatively low levels of use, in part likely to the older demographic completing the survey. There are also low levels of use of the waterway corridors.

In terms of the most frequently used open space, local streets for exercise are the most popular followed by small local parks and the third being urban squares/large parks and gardens. The waterway corridors and major regional parklands are not fulfilling a role in the being frequently used, all with less than 10 per cent use.


2.6 Facilities and features in open space

2.6.1 Use of facilities in open space

The following graph highlights various types of facilities used in open space by residents of the City of Whittlesea in the last twelve months. Percentages are calculated on the basis of the number of respondents who use the open space facility as a proportion of 571 surveys.

82 per cent of respondents used walking paths in the last twelve months. This is followed by 66 per cent using seats, 62 per cent open grassed areas for informal use, 60 per cent playgrounds and playspaces, and 51 per cent using picnic tables.

This graph reinforces the popularity of walking and the unstructured use of open space including the seats and informal open grassed areas. Club-based sport facilities have low levels of use along with informal outdoor recreation facilities, fitness equipment and the skate facilities. These facilities are more commonly used by children and young adults and this group is not well represented in the survey.




2.6.2 Provision of facilities in open space

The following graph illustrates the percentage of residents that consider the various facilities within open space either are or are not adequately provided for. Percentages are calculated on the total of 571 surveys.

Overall, the results of this question indicate there is a low level of satisfaction with the provision of facilities in open space. While the previous graph highlights the high levels of use of walking paths, only 39 per cent of respondents consider these are well provided for, and walking paths are considered the best provided for facility in the Municipality. Only one third of the 66 per cent of respondents that use seats say there are enough. For public toilets only one quarter of the 49 per cent who use these facilities say there are enough.

Interpretation of these results indicates that there is scope to improve facility provision in open space to encourage greater use. This includes the following facilities in priority order where 20 per cent or more responded they are not well provided for:


- Public toilets
- Seats
- · Picnic tables
- Walking paths



2.6.3 Maintenance of facilities in open space

The following graph illustrates the level of satisfaction with the maintenance of open space facilities over the last 12 months. The percentages are calculated on the total 571 surveys.

More than 50 per cent of City of Whittlesea respondents are satisfied with the level of maintenance for walking paths, and almost 50 per cent are satisfied with open grassed areas for informal use, playgrounds and play spaces, and seats, consistent with the higher level of use of these facilities. Overall, when assessing the results of the three questions relating to facilities in open space, the lack of them and lower level of use are more of an issue than their maintenance.



2.7 General comments on open space

Respondents were provided a section where they were able to write any additional comments on the open space within the municipality and their local area. The following is a summary of these comments from the City of Whittlesea, which have been grouped together into topics and assembled in priority order. These comments are important as they are unprompted and have been summarised from larger statements.

The highest number of general comments received indicated Whittlesea residents (23) would like more public toilets provided in open space. A number of residents (20) would also like to see additional dog off-lead areas provided as well as additional open space in general (17), and additional multi-use open spaces (14).

While some residents indicated they enjoy using open space, they also commented on the management and maintenance of open space suggesting regular maintenance of streetscapes (13) and open space. There were also some concerns regarding the impact of development on open space (14).


2.8 Worker population use of open space

2.8.1 Do you live and work in the City of Whittlesea?

210 (33%) per cent of the total number of survey respondents work in the City of Whittlesea. 151 (72%) both live and work in the City of Whittlesea. 59 (28%) of respondents indicate they only work in the City of Whittlesea and do not live in the municipality.


2.8.2 What is the postcode where you work?

36 per cent of respondents confirmed their workplace location within the City of Whittlesea and there were no responses from workers in Woodstock or Yan Yean.

62 per cent of the 210 respondents who indicated they work in the City of Whittlesea also visit open space near their workplace at question 15.



2.8.4 Can you give the reason/s why you visit the open space near your workplace?

49 per cent of respondents visit open space near their workplace to be outdoors as a break from work. 37 per cent of respondents indicated they use open space near work for informal fitness/exercise activities. Socialising and club-based sport were less popular reasons to visit open space near work.



2.9 Who completed the survey

630 respondents completed the survey. 571 indicated that they live in the City of Whittlesea and 59 respondents indicated they only work and don't live in the municipality. The survey was defined such that the workers only answered questions related to open space near their workplace. These are summarised in Section 2.8 of this report. All other questions were answered by those living in the City of Whittlesea (571).


2.9.1 Gender

2.9.2 Age Range





2.9.4 Dwelling type


The quantity of private open space available to residents can influence their use of open space. Generally, detached dwellings have more private open space available than semi-detached dwellings or apartments, and changes in this can influence the usage patterns and level of demand for public open space.

More than 90 per cent of respondents live in detached houses, followed by semi or row (6.5%), with only a small proportion of respondents living in a flat/apartment or other type of housing. This is consistent with the census data meaning there is a good representation from each dwelling type in the survey outcomes.




2.9.5 Household type


2.9.6 Country of birth

The responses are generally consistent with the 2011 Census data with a slight under representation of respondents born in Greece, Macedonia, Italy and India.




2.9.7 Language spoken at home

3.1 Overview


The outcomes of the completed surveys have been summarised by precinct. The precincts names and areas are consistent with the precincts from the City of Whittlesea Community Profile.

The Open Space Strategy makes recommendations for the future provision, design and management of open space in the established urban and rural areas of the municipality, excluding the growth areas. Therefore, the survey distribution was targeted to the established urban and rural areas of the municipality. Only precincts that have either wholly or partially established urban and rural areas in them have been summarised separately and included in this section of the consultation report.

These precinct summaries inform the precinct analysis and recommendations contained in the City of Whittlesea Open Space Strategy. The precincts are listed in alphabetical order, which correlates to the order in which they are presented in the Strategy.

3.2.4 Open space not visited

This question was asked to find out what issues currently limit the use of existing open space by respondents. The question included some of the common reasons why people may not use open space. The reasons can apply either to a specific open space or more broadly to open space in general.

Two per cent of respondents indicated that they would like to visit open space but are unable to.

Two Blossom Park respondents indicated the reason for not visiting open space was due to the lack of public transport. Other reasons were travel distance, lack of time, personal safety and open space being too remote.

The 'other' reason a respondent did not visit open space generally, or a specific open space was because it was closed. The specific open space not visited was Plenty Gorge Park.

3.2.5 Types of open space visited and frequency of use

The following table shows the frequency of use of different types of open space in Blossom Park.


In terms of the most frequently used open space, local streets for exercise are the most popular followed by medium sized parks and the third being large parks and gardens. The daily use of local streets for exercise is very high compared with the Municipal average. This could be partly explained by the comparatively lower number of smaller open spaces in Blossom Park. 22 per cent is allocated to Plenty River and major regional parklands suggesting that even though Plenty Gorge Park is the major open space in this precinct, it is not well used due to limited path/trail access points to it.

3.2.6 Facilities and features in open space

3.2.6a Use of facilities and features in open space

The following table indicates use of facilities in open space over the last twelve months. The percentages are calculated on the number of returned surveys from Blossom Park, 9.

- Walking paths, seats, open grassed areas for informal use and playgrounds were the most popular facilities used in the last 12 months, consistent with the Municipal average.
- Higher levels of use of public toilets, picnic tables, drinking fountains, and cafe/kiosk by Blossom Park respondents was due to the lower number of total responses.



Interpretation of these results indicates that there is scope to improve facility provision in open space to encourage greater use. This includes the following facilities in priority order where 20 per cent or more responded they are not well provided for:

- Barbecues, picnic tables, drinking fountains, seats and fitness equipment
- Shelters, dog-off leash areas, cafe/kiosk
- Walking paths, cycle paths, open grassed areas for informal use, public toilets, informal outdoor recreation facilities, club-based outdoor sport and recreation facilities and club-based indoor sport and recreation facilities

A summary of other comments on the graph includes:

 Blossom Park respondents' general level of satisfaction with the provision of facilities is in accordance with the Municipal average.



3.3 Bundoora

Number of respondents

55 respondents indicated they live in Bundoora. This represents 9 per cent of the total surveys received. Census data figures indicate that 7 per cent of the City of Whittlesea is from Bundoora.

Respondents were asked to indicate what they valued most about the open spaces in their Municipality and were invited to select any of the twenty-three values listed, with an option to add additional values under the 'other' category.

Percentages are calculated on the basis of the total number of returned surveys for Bundoora, 55. The table below illustrates the information, listing the twenty-three values in priority order.

73 per cent of Bundoora respondents consider the opportunity to relax and unwind as the most valued feature of open space, consistent with the Municipal average. This is followed by trees at 58 per cent, open space as an escape from traffic noise and movement at 53 per cent, and fitness at 49 per cent. The last two are 10 and 12 per cent higher the Municipal average respectively.

3.3.4 Open space not visited

Part 1 – whether there is open space they would like to visit but are unable to.


Part 2 – the reasons they are unable to visit open space.

Part 3 – specific open spaces they are unable to visit.


The percentages nominated in Part 1 are a proportion of the total 55 surveys received. The percentages nominated in Part 2 are a percentage of the 19 respondents who answered yes to the first part of the question.

Part 1 Is there open space you would like to visit but are unable to?

35 per cent of respondents indicated that they would like to visit open space but are unable to. This is slightly higher than the Municipal average of 32 per cent.

Reasons Bundoora respondents do not visit open space

The most frequent reason for not visiting open space was lack of time at 47 per cent, consistent with the Municipal average. This was followed by travel distance at 37 per cent and the open space being too remote at 21 per cent. Both these reasons were 4 per cent below the Municipal average. Poor accessibility to open space due to busy traffic was not selected as a reason for not visiting open space by Bundoora respondents.

21 per cent of Bundoora respondents selected the 'other' category and listed other reasons they don't visit open space generally, or a specific open space. These included lack of information/knowledge (2), additional dog off-lead areas required (1), and too far to travel (1).

Part 3 Specific open spaces that you would like to visit but are unable to:

35 per cent of Bundoora respondents said they would like to visit open space but are unable to. 9 per cent indicate they don't visit open space in general, while 24 per cent indicate they don't visit a specific open space.

Large parks and gardens are the most frequently used type of open space by Bundoora respondents, which is 19 per cent higher than the Municipal average. 85 per cent of Bundoora respondents also utilise local streets for exercise, 3 per cent higher than the Municipal average.

65 per cent of Bundoora respondents use medium sized parks, which is 16 per cent higher than the Municipal average, while Darebin Creek is used 13 per cent more than the overall Municipality. The use of sporting reserves was 27 per cent lower in Bundoora compared to the Municipal average.


In terms of the most frequently used open space, local streets for exercise are the most popular followed by large parks and gardens and the third being small local parks. Major regional parklands, sporting reserves and Plenty River all received less than 10 per cent levels of use, while large parks and gardens received higher levels of frequent use when compared with the Municipal average.

3.3.6 Facilities and features in open space

3.3.6a Use of facilities and features in open space

The following table indicates use of facilities in open space over the last twelve months. The percentages are calculated on the number of returned surveys from Bundoora, 55.

- 87 per cent of respondents indicated walking paths are the most popular facility, 5 per cent more than the overall Municipal average.
- 67 per cent used seats, consistent with the Municipal average, and 62 per cent of Bundoora respondents indicated they used open grassed areas for informal use.
- Only 9 per cent of Bundoora respondents used dog off-leash areas in the last 12 months, 14 per cent lower than the overall Municipality.
- Use of club-based sport and recreation, informal outdoor recreation and fitness equipment were all slightly lower than the Municipal average.



3.3.6b Provision of facilities in open space


The following graph illustrates the percentage of respondents that consider the various facilities within open space either are or are not adequately provided for. Percentages are calculated on the total number of Bundoora surveys received, 55.

Interpretation of these results indicates that there is scope to improve facility provision in open space to encourage greater use. This includes the following facilities in priority order where 20 per cent or more responded they are not well provided for:

- · Public toilets
- Seats
- Drinking fountains
- Barbecues and shelters


 Although there is a high level of use of walking paths in Bundoora, only 45 per cent of Bundoora respondents consider walking paths well provided for. This is however 6 per cent more than the Municipal average.



3.3.6c Maintenance of facilities in open space

The following graph illustrates the level of satisfaction with open space facilities. The percentages are calculated on the total number of Bundoora surveys returned, 55.

- Overall, Bundoora respondents are generally more satisfied with the level of maintenance of facilities in open space compared with the Municipal average.
- 73 per cent of Bundoora respondents were satisfied with the level of maintenance of walking paths, which is 16 per cent above the Municipal average.
- 56 per cent of Bundoora respondents were satisfied with the maintenance level of open grassed areas for informal use, 7 per cent above the Municipal average.
- 9 per cent of respondents considered dog off-leash areas well provided for, 9 per cent lower than the Municipal average.
- Satisfaction with the maintenance level of informal outdoor recreation facilities, dog off-leash areas, club-based indoor and outdoor sport and recreation facilities, and cafe/kiosk facilities were all lower than the Municipal average.

3.4 Epping

Number of respondents

69 respondents indicated they live in Epping. This represents 11 per cent of the total surveys received. Census figures indicate that 12 per cent of the City of Whittlesea population live in Epping.

3.4.1 Values of open space

Respondents were asked to indicate what they valued most about the open spaces in their Municipality and were invited to select any of the twenty-three values listed, with an option to add additional values under the 'other' category.

Percentages are calculated on the basis of the total number of returned surveys for Epping, 69. The table below illustrates the information, listing the twenty-three values in priority order.

62 per cent of respondents indicated that open space as a place for kids to play is the most valued feature of open space in Epping, consistent with the Municipal average. 58 per cent of respondents also consider the opportunity to relax and unwind in open space important however this is 14 per cent below the Municipal average. Over 50 per cent of respondents consider trees as a valuable feature of open space however this is 11 per cent less than the Municipal average.

3.4.4 Open space not visited

This question was asked to find out what issues currently limit the use of existing open space by respondents. The question included some of the common reasons why people may not use open space. The reasons can apply either to a specific open space or more broadly to open space in general.

The question has been analysed below in 3 parts:

Part 1 – whether there is open space they would like to visit but are unable to.


Part 2 – the reasons they are unable to visit open space.

Part 3 – specific open spaces they are unable to visit.


The percentages nominated in Part 1 are a proportion of the total 69 surveys received. The percentages nominated in Part 2 are a percentage of the 18 respondents who answered yes to the first part of the question.

Part 1 Is there open space you would like to visit but are unable to?

26 per cent of respondents indicated that they would like to visit open space but are unable to. This is slightly lower than the Municipal average of 32 per cent.

Reasons Epping respondents do not visit open space

The most frequent reasons for not visiting open space were travel distance at 61 per cent, followed by lack of time at 56 per cent. These are 20 per cent and 8 per cent above the Municipal average respectively. 22 per cent of Epping respondents indicated personal safety concerns as a reason, however this is 7 per cent below the Municipal average. Lack of public transport and open space being uninviting were also cited as reasons by 11 per cent of respondents. These were 12 and 11 per cent below the Municipal average respectively.

39 per cent of Epping respondents selected the 'other' category and listed other reasons they don't visit open space generally, or a specific open space. These included facilities do not appeal to me or my family (2), lack of information/knowledge (2) and lack of footpath (1).

Part 3 Specific open spaces that you would like to visit but are unable to:

26 per cent of Epping respondents said they would like to visit open space but are unable to. 16 per cent indicate they don't visit open space in general, while 13 per cent indicate they don't visit a specific open space. There are lower than the Municipal average. The following table indicates the specific open spaces not visited by respondents.

Small local parks are the most frequently used type of open space by Epping respondents, 3 per cent above the Municipal average, and with 28 per cent using them monthly. 81 per cent of Epping respondents also utilise local streets for exercise, consistent with the Municipal average. Large parks and gardens were used by 62 per cent of Epping respondents, 8 per cent lower than the Municipal average.

59 per cent of Epping respondents use Darebin Creek, which is 30 per cent higher than the Municipal average. Merri Creek was used by 7 per cent more Epping respondents compared with the Municipal average.


In terms of the most frequently used open space, local streets for exercise are the most popular followed by small local parks and the third being Darebin Creek. Darebin Creek is the key linear open space close to the residential population, while Edgars Creek passes through the non-residential land in this precinct explaining its lower level of use.

3.4.6 Facilities and features in open space

3.4.6a Use of facilities and features in open space

The following table indicates use of facilities in open space over the last twelve months. The percentages are calculated on the number of returned surveys from Epping, 69.

- Epping respondents indicated walking paths are the most popular facility being used by 84 per cent of respondents, consistent with the Municipal average.
- Seats were used by 62 per cent of Epping respondents in the last twelve months, 4 per cent less than the overall Municipality.
- Open grassed areas for informal use and playgrounds were used by over 50 per cent of respondents however this is approximately 5 per cent lower than the Municipal average.
- Public toilets were used 23 per cent less by Epping respondents than the Municipal average of 49 per cent.



3.4.6b Provision of facilities in open space


The following graph illustrates the percentage of respondents that consider the various facilities within open space either are or are not adequately provided for. Percentages are calculated on the total number of Epping surveys received, 69.

Interpretation of these results indicates that there is scope to improve facility provision in open space to encourage greater use. This includes the following facilities in priority order where 20 per cent or more responded they are not well provided for:

- Seats
- · Drinking fountains
- Shelters
- Picnic tables and dog off-leash areas
- · Barbecues and public toilets
- Walking paths
- · Fitness equipment and informal outdoor recreation facilities

A summary of other comments on the graph includes:


- Epping respondents indicated they were generally less satisfied with the
 provision of open space facilities including BBQs, shelters, drinking fountains,
 seats, informal outdoor recreation facilities and dog off-leash areas than the
 rest of the Municipality. The level of dissatisfaction in Epping for provision of
 these facilities was approximately 10 per cent higher than the Municipal
 average.
- Playgrounds are considered the best provided for facility in Epping by 42 per cent of respondents, which is 9 per cent more than the overall Municipality.



3.4.6c Maintenance of facilities in open space

The following graph illustrates the level of satisfaction with the maintenance of open space facilities. The percentages are calculated on the total number of Epping surveys returned, 69.

- 62 per cent of Epping respondents were satisfied with the maintenance level of walking paths, 5 per cent higher than the Municipal average.
- Open grassed areas for informal use are considered well maintained by 55 per cent of respondents, 6 per cent higher than the Municipal average.
- Respondents were most dissatisfied with the maintenance level of drinking fountains at 26 per cent, 14 per cent higher than the Municipal average.

3.5 Lalor

Number of respondents

41 respondents indicated they live in Lalor. This represents 7 per cent of total surveys received. Census figures indicate that 13 per cent of the City of Whittlesea population is from Lalor.

3.5.1 Values of open space

Respondents were asked to indicate what they valued most about the open spaces in their Municipality and were invited to select any of the twenty-three values listed, with an option to add additional values under the 'other' category.

Percentages are calculated on the basis of the total number of returned surveys for Lalor, 41. The table below illustrates the information, listing the twenty-three values in priority order.

88 per cent of respondents value open space as a place to relax and unwind which is 16 per cent higher than the Municipal average. 66 per cent of respondents value open space as a habitat for native plants and animals, 12 per cent higher than the Municipal average. 63 per cent of Lalor respondents consider trees and a place for kids to play as valued features in open space consistent with the Municipal average. Over 50 per cent of respondents consider open space important as an escape from buildings and roads and for flowers/garden beds, more than 10 per cent higher than the Municipal average.

3.5.4 Open space not visited

Part 1 – whether there is open space they would like to visit but are unable to.


Part 2 – the reasons they are unable to visit open space.

Part 3 – specific open spaces they are unable to visit.


The percentages nominated in Part 1 are a proportion of the total 41 surveys received. The percentages nominated in Part 2 are a percentage of the 19 respondents who answered yes to the first part of the question.

Part 1 Is there open space you would like to visit but are unable to?

46 per cent of respondents indicated that they would like to visit open space but are unable to. This is significantly higher than the Municipal average of 32 per cent.

Reasons Lalor respondents do not visit open space

The most frequent reason for not visiting open space is lack of time at 47 per cent. This is followed by personal safety at 32 per cent, 3 per cent higher than the Municipal average, and too far to travel, also at 32 per cent. Lack of public transport, the remoteness of open space, and access constraints from busy traffic were also important factors. Fewer Lalor respondents nominated unappealing or uninviting as reasons they don't visit open space compared with the Municipal average.

21 per cent of Lalor respondents selected the 'other' category and listed other reasons they don't visit open space generally, or a specific open space. Reasons include facilities do not appeal to me or my family (1), lack of information/knowledge (1), lack of public transport (1), and lack of time (1).

Part 3 Specific open spaces that you would like to visit but are unable to:

46 per cent of Lalor respondents said they would like to visit open space but are unable to. 20 per cent indicate they don't visit open space in general, and 20 per cent indicate they don't visit a specific open space. These are lower than the Municipal average.


In terms of the most frequently used open space, local streets for exercise are the most popular followed by small local parks and the third being urban squares. The waterway corridors including Darebin Creek and Edgars Creek are not fulfilling their potential role as important linear open spaces, with lower levels of use for these in comparison with other spaces.

3.5.6 Facilities and features in open space

3.5.6a Use of facilities and features in open space

The following table indicates use of facilities in open space over the last twelve months. The percentages are calculated on the number of returned surveys from Lalor, 41.

- When compared with the Municipal average, Lalor respondents generally did not use facilities and features in open space as frequently in the last 12 months, except for open grassed areas for informal use which was 9 per cent higher.
- The use of club based indoor sport and cafe/kiosk facilities was also slightly higher than the Municipal average.
- The use of walking paths and cycle paths in Lalor was approximately 10 per cent lower than the Municipal average.
- Over 50 per cent of respondents indicated they had not used BBQs, shelters, fitness equipment, informal outdoor recreation facilities and dog off-leash areas. These were higher than the Municipal average by an average of 20 per cent.



3.5.6b Provision of facilities in open space


The following graph illustrates the percentage of respondents that consider the various facilities within open space either are or are not adequately provided for. Percentages are calculated on the total number of Lalor surveys received, 41.

Interpretation of these results indicates that there is scope to improve facility provision in open space to encourage greater use. This includes the following facilities in priority order where 20 per cent or more responded they are not well provided for:

- · Seats and public toilets
- Walking paths
- Fitness equipment, picnic tables, cafe/kiosk
- Dog off-leash areas and drinking fountains
- · Shelters and informal outdoor recreation facilities
- Playgrounds

A summary of other comments on the graph includes:


- Lalor respondents generally indicated that facilities in open space are slightly less well provided for when compared to the Municipal average.
- 32 per cent of respondents indicated that walking paths are not well provided for, 11 per cent higher than the Municipal average.
- The level of satisfaction with the provision of club-based outdoor and indoor facilities in Lalor was higher than the Municipal average by 13 per cent and 9 per cent respectively.



3.5.6c Maintenance of facilities in open space

The following graph illustrates the level of satisfaction with the maintenance of open space facilities. The percentages are calculated on the total number of Lalor surveys returned, 41.

- 24 per cent of respondents indicated they were not satisfied with the maintenance level of open grassed areas, 17 per cent higher than the Municipal average.
- Lalor respondents were satisfied with the maintenance of club-based indoor sport facilities and cafe/kiosk, at 10 per cent and 12 per cent higher than the Municipal average respectively.
- 27 per cent of respondents were not satisfied with the maintenance level of public toilets, a 10 per cent increase compared with the Municipal average.

3.6 Mill Park

Number of respondents

Respondents were asked to indicate what they valued most about the open spaces in their Municipality and were invited to select any of the twenty-three values listed, with an option to add additional values under the 'other' category.

Percentages are calculated on the basis of the total number of returned surveys for Mill Park, 123. The table below illustrates the information, listing the twenty-three values in priority order.

80 per cent of respondents consider the opportunity to relax and unwind as the most valued feature of open space, which is 8 per cent higher than the Municipal average. Over 50 per cent of respondents consider open space important for trees, as a place for kids to play, as a habitat for native plants and animals, and for health and wellbeing, consistent with the Municipal average.

The question has been analysed below in 3 parts:


- Part 1 whether there is open space they would like to visit but are unable to.


3.6 Mill Park

Part 1 Is there open space you would like to visit but are unable to?

29 per cent of respondents indicated that they would like to visit open space but are unable to. This is slightly lower than the Municipal average, 32 per cent.

Reasons Mill Park respondents do not visit open space

The most frequent reason for not visiting open space was due to lack of time at 56 per cent, 8 per cent above the Municipal average. 36 per cent of Mill Park respondents were concerned with personal safety, 7 per cent more than the Municipal average. These reasons were followed by travel distance to open space at 31 per cent; open space being uninviting at 28 per cent; and open space being remote at 25 per cent. Compared to the Municipal average, 10 per cent less respondents in Mill Park considered travel distance to open space as an issue. 6 per cent more Mill Park respondents indicated open space being uninviting as a reason for not visiting open space. Constraints from busy traffic was only cited by 8 per cent of respondents, which is 7 per cent below the Municipal average.

31 per cent of Mill Park respondents selected the 'other' category and listed other reasons they don't visit open space generally, or a specific open space. These included lack of information/knowledge (3), access - closed (1), additional dog

off-lead areas required (1), facilities do not appeal to me or my family (1), lack of car parking (1), lack of footpath (1), lack of signage (1), and unclean - graffiti (1).

Part 3 Specific open spaces that you would like to visit but are unable to:

29 per cent of Mill Park respondents said they would like to visit open space but are unable to. 19 per cent indicate they don't visit open space in general, while 9 per cent indicate they don't visit a specific open space. This is lower than the Municipal average.

Local streets for exercise are the most frequently used type of open space by 91 per cent of Mill Park respondents, 9 per cent higher than the Municipal average. 84 per cent of respondents utilise large parks and gardens, which is 14 per cent higher than the Municipal average.

Respondents also used medium sized parks 5 per cent more frequently than the Municipal average.


In terms of the most frequently used open space, local streets for exercise are the most popular followed by small local parks and the third being large parks and gardens. This generally reflects that the open space network is nearby and easily accessible in Mill Park.

3.6.6 Facilities and features in open space

3.6.6a Use of facilities and features in open space

The following table indicates use of facilities in open space over the last twelve months. The percentages are calculated on the number of returned surveys from Mill Park, 123.

- Mill Park respondents indicated that walking paths, seats and open grassed areas were the most popular facilities used in the last 12 months, approximately 5 per cent higher than the Municipal average.
- The use of picnic tables and drinking fountains was also slightly higher in Mill Park when compared with the Municipal average.
- A slightly higher percentage of Mill Park respondents indicated they did not use fitness equipment, informal outdoor recreation facilities, dog off-leash areas, and club-based indoor and outdoor recreation facilities, when compared with the Municipal average.
- 8 to 10 per cent more Mill Park respondents indicated they did not use cycle paths, public toilets and barbeques when compared with the Municipal average.



3.6.6b Provision of facilities in open space


The following graph illustrates the percentage of respondents that consider the various facilities within open space either are or are not adequately provided for. Percentages are calculated on the total number of Mill Park surveys received, 123.

Interpretation of these results indicates that there is scope to improve facility provision in open space to encourage greater use. This includes the following facilities in priority order where 20 per cent or more responded they are not well provided for:

- Public toilets
- Picnic tables
- Seats
- Walking paths and cycle paths
- Dog off-leash areas

A summary of other comments on the graph includes:

- 50 per cent of respondents indicated they are satisfied with the provision of walking paths in Mill Park, which is 11 per cent higher than the Municipal average.
- 40 per cent of Mill Park respondents indicated open grassed areas for informal use and playgrounds are well provided for, which is slightly higher than the Municipal average.
- Mill Park respondents were generally less satisfied with the provision of picnic tables, public toilets, drinking fountains, cycle paths and seats than the Municipal average.



3.7 Rural North

Number of respondents

53 respondents indicated they live in the Rural North part of the Municipality. Surveys were received from the following suburbs: Beveridge (3), Eden Park (35), Humevale (8), Kinglake West (2), Wollert (1), Woodstock (1), and Yan Yean (3). The respondents from the Rural North represent 8 per cent of total surveys received. Census figures indicate 2 per cent of the City of Whittlesea lives in the Rural North.

3.7.1 Values of open space

Respondents were asked to indicate what they valued most about the open spaces in their Municipality and were invited to select any of the twenty-three values listed, with an option to add additional values under the 'other' category.

Percentages are calculated on the basis of the total number of returned surveys for Rural North, 53. The table below illustrates the information, listing the twenty-three values in priority order.

62 per cent of respondents indicated that trees are the most valued feature of open space in Rural North, which is consistent with the Municipal average. 58 per cent of respondents also consider the opportunity to relax and unwind in open space as important, however this is 14 per cent lower than the Municipal average. 57 per cent indicated they value open space as a habitat for native plants and animals, followed by 53 per cent choosing natural bushland character as a value. 34 per cent value the diversity of open space, which is 8 per cent above the Municipal average. 26 per cent value being outside in open space, and this is 19 per cent below the Municipal average.







23 per cent of respondents indicated that they would like to visit open space but are unable to. This is lower than the Municipal average of 32 per cent.







Reasons Rural North respondents do not visit open space

The most frequent reasons for not visiting open space were lack of time at 32 per cent and travel distance at 26 per cent, which were 16 and 15 per cent lower than the Municipal average respectively. Responses to this question were generally significantly lower in Rural North compared to the overall Municipality. Concerns about personal safety and open space being too remote were 26 and 19 per cent below the Municipal average respectively. There were no Rural North respondents who found open space uninviting.

10 per cent of Rural North respondents selected the 'other' category and listed other reasons they don't visit open space generally, or a specific open space. These included poor health - unable to visit open space (2), safety - used needles/syringes in open space (2), access - not open to public (1), lack of car parking (1), lack of knowledge that it's there (1), and feeling unsafe - lack of passive surveillance.

23 per cent of Rural North respondents said they would like to visit open space but are unable to. Of these, 73 per cent indicate they don't visit open space in general, while 27 per cent indicate they don't visit a specific open space.


In terms of the most frequently used open space, local streets for exercise are the most popular followed by small local parks and the third being major regional parklands. The higher level of use in the major regional parklands reflects the proximity of major open space to Rural North including Yan Yean and Toorourrong Reservoirs.

3.7.6 Facilities and features in open space

3.7.6a Use of facilities and features in open space

The following table indicates use of facilities in open space used over the last twelve months. The percentages are calculated on the number of returned surveys from Rural North, 53.

- Rural North respondents indicated public toilets are the most popular facility and are used by 68 per cent of respondents, 19 per cent more than the overall Municipal average.
- This is followed by seats which were used by 60 per cent of Rural North respondents in the last twelve months, consistent Municipal wide.
- Walking paths were used by only 47 per cent of respondents from the Rural North, 35 per cent lower than the Municipal average.
- 40 per cent of respondents used open grassed areas for informal use and 38 per cent used playgrounds. These facilities were used 22 per cent less than the Municipal average.
- 36 per cent of Rural North respondents used club-based outdoor recreation facilities and 21 per cent used club-based indoor recreation facilities, slightly more than the Municipal average.



3.7.6b Provision of facilities in open space


The following graph illustrates the percentage of respondents that consider the various facilities within open space either are or are not adequately provided for. Percentages are calculated on the total number of Rural North surveys received, 53.

Interpretation of these results indicates that there is scope to improve facility provision in open space to encourage greater use. This includes the following facilities in priority order where 20 per cent or more responded they are not well provided for:

- · Public toilets
- Seats
- · Picnic tables
- Walking paths

A summary of other comments on the graph includes:


- 42 per cent of respondents do not consider public toilets to be well provided for, 12 per cent higher than the Municipal average.
- Only 17 per cent of Rural North respondents consider walking paths well provided for, which is 22 per cent lower than the Municipal average.
- 19 per cent of Rural North respondents are satisfied with the provision of playgrounds, 14 per cent lower than the Municipal average.



3.7.6c Maintenance of facilities in open space

The following graph illustrates the level of satisfaction with the maintenance of open space facilities. The percentages are calculated on the total number of Rural North surveys returned, 53.

- Public toilets are considered the best maintained facility in Rural North at 57 per cent, 31 per cent higher than the Municipal average.
- 26 per cent of Rural North respondents are satisfied with the maintenance level of walking paths, 28 per cent lower than the overall Municipality.
- 32 per cent of respondents are satisfied with the maintenance level of clubbased outdoor recreation facilities, 12 per cent higher than the Municipal average.

3.8 South Morang

Number of Respondents

33 respondents indicated they live in South Morang. This represents 5 per cent of total surveys received. Census figures indicate 12 per cent of the City of Whittlesea population lives in South Morang.

3.8.1 Values of open space

Respondents were asked to indicate what they valued most about the open spaces in their municipality and were invited to select any of the twenty-three values listed, with an option to add additional values under the 'other' category.

Percentages are calculated on the basis of the total number of returned surveys for South Morang, 33. The table below illustrates the information, listing the twenty-three values in priority order.

79 per cent of South Morang respondents consider the opportunity to relax and unwind in open space as the most valued feature of open space, 7 per cent higher than the Municipal average. Open space as a place for kids to play is valued by 76 per cent of respondents, 13 per cent higher than the Municipal average. Respondents also valued open space for its spaciousness, for meeting people/friends, and for playing sport. These were all more than ten per cent higher the Municipal average.

3.8.4 Open space not visited

This question was asked to find out what issues currently limit the use of existing open space by respondents. The question included some of the common reasons why people may not use open space. The reasons can apply either to a specific open space or more broadly to open space in general.

The question has been analysed below in 3 parts:

Part 1 – whether there is open space they would like to visit but are unable to.


Part 2 – the reasons they are unable to visit open space.

Part 3 – specific open spaces they are unable to visit.


The percentages nominated in Part 1 are a proportion of the total 33 surveys received. The percentages nominated in Part 2 are a percentage of the 10 respondents who answered yes to the first part of the question.

Part 1 Is there open space you would like to visit but are unable to?

30 per cent of respondents indicated that they would like to visit open space but are unable to. This is slightly lower than the Municipal average of 32 per cent.

Reasons South Morang respondents do not visit open space

The most frequent reasons for not visiting open space were personal safety concerns and remoteness of open space at 60 per cent. South Morang respondents were concerned with personal safety 31 per cent less than the Municipal average and concerned with remoteness of open space 35 per cent more. 50 per cent of respondents indicated the lack of public transport as a reason not to visit open space, followed by 40 per cent finding open space facilities unappealing. These were above the Municipal average by 27 and 17 per cent respectively. 30 per cent of South Morang respondents cited access constraints from busy traffic and open space being uninviting as important factors. These were above the Municipal average by 15 per cent and 8 per cent respectively. Travel distance to open space was less influential in South Morang, with only 20 per cent selecting it, compared to 41 per cent Municipal wide.

30 per cent of South Morang respondents selected the 'other' category and listed other reasons they don't visit open space generally, or a specific open space. These included lack of footpath (1), and personal safety (1).

Part 3 Specific open spaces that you would like to visit but are unable to:

30 per cent of South Morang respondents said they would like to visit open space but are unable to. 71 per cent of these indicate they don't visit open space in general, while 29 per cent indicate they don't visit a specific open space.

94 per cent of respondents indicated local streets for exercise are the most frequently used type of open space, 12 per cent higher than the Municipal average. This is followed by 88 per cent using small local parks, 8 per cent higher than the Municipal average. 79 per cent of respondents use major regional parklands, 7 per cent above the Municipal average. This type of open space is used mostly once or twice a year, consistent with the Municipal average.

61 per cent of respondents use sporting reserves, which is 14 per cent higher than the Municipal average, while Plenty River is used 13 per cent more compared with the Municipal average.



The following table indicates use of facilities in open space over the last twelve months. The percentages are calculated on the number of returned surveys from South Morang, 33.

- South Morang respondents' use of the facilities is generally higher than the overall Municipality, with the most frequently used facilities being walking paths, playgrounds, and open grassed areas for informal use.
- South Morang respondents indicated walking paths are the most popular facility used in the last twelve months being used by 91 per cent of respondents, 9 per cent more than the overall Municipal average.
- Playgrounds were used by 82 per cent of South Morang respondents in the last twelve months, 22 per cent higher than the overall Municipal average.
- Club-based outdoor and indoor recreation facilities were used more in South Morang, at 15 per cent and 20 per cent higher than the Municipal average respectively.
- 52 per cent of South Morang respondents used shelters, a 14 per cent increase compared to the Municipal average.
- The use of cycle paths, open grassed areas, public toilets, BBQs and picnic tables was generally 10 per cent higher than the Municipal average.







The following graph illustrates the level of satisfaction with the maintenance level of open space facilities. The percentages are calculated on the total number of South Morang surveys returned, 33.

- Overall, South Morang respondents are generally more satisfied with the level of maintenance of facilities in open space compared with the Municipal averages.
- 76 per cent of South Morang respondents indicated that walking paths are well maintained, 19 per cent above the Municipal average.
- 55 per cent of respondents were satisfied with the maintenance of playgrounds and open grassed areas for informal use, over 15 per cent higher than the Municipal averages.
- The level of satisfaction with maintenance of shelters in South Morang was 24 per cent higher than the Municipal average.

3.9 Thomastown

Number of respondents

62 respondents indicated they live in Thomastown. This represents 10 percent of total surveys received. Census figures indicate 13 per cent of the City of Whittlesea population lives in Thomastown.

3.9.1 Values of open space

Respondents were asked to indicate what they valued most about the open spaces in their Municipality and were invited to select any of the twenty-three values listed, with an option to add additional values under the 'other' category.

Percentages are calculated on the basis of the total number of returned surveys for Thomastown, 62. The table below illustrates the information, listing the twenty-three values in priority order.

68 per cent of respondents consider trees as the most valued features of open space in Thomastown, this is 6 per cent higher than the Municipal average. Open space for being outside, flowers/garden beds, and fitness are also all valued more highly by Thomastown respondents when compared with the Municipal average.

3.9.4 Open space not visited

This question was asked to find out what issues currently limit the use of existing open space by respondents. The question included some of the common reasons why people may not use open space. The reasons can apply either to a specific open space or more broadly to open space in general.

The question has been analysed below in 3 parts:

Part 1 – whether there is open space they would like to visit but are unable to.


Part 2 – the reasons they are unable to visit open space.

Part 3 – specific open spaces they are unable to visit.


The percentages nominated in Part 1 are a proportion of the total 62 surveys received. The percentages nominated in Part 2 are a percentage of the 23 respondents who answered yes to the first part of the question.

Part 1 Is there open space you would like to visit but are unable to?

37 per cent of respondents indicated that they would like to visit open space but are unable to. This is higher than the Municipal average of 32 per cent.

Reasons Thomastown respondents do not visit open space

The most frequent reason for not visiting open space was travel distance at 52 per cent, followed by personal safety at 48 per cent. These were an 11 per cent and 19 per cent higher respectively when compared to the Municipal average. 39 per cent of Thomastown respondents do not visit open space due to remoteness, 14 per cent above the Municipal average. 39 per cent of respondents also identified lack of time as a reason, however this is 9 per cent below the Municipal average. These were followed by the reason that open space was uninviting at 35 per cent, which is above the Municipal average of 22 per cent.

39 per cent of Thomastown respondents selected the 'other' category and listed other reasons they don't visit open space generally, or a specific open space. These included lack of information/knowledge (4), as well as facilities do not appeal to me or my family (1), health issues (1), lack of footpath (1), and personal safety concerns (1).

Part 3 Specific open spaces that you would like to visit but are unable to:

37 per cent of Thomastown respondents said they would like to visit open space but are unable to. 27 per cent indicate they don't visit open space in general, while 5 per cent indicate they don't visit a specific open space. The specific open space not visited by respondents was Yan Yean Reservoir Park.

3.9.5 Types of open space visited and frequency of use

The percentages are calculated based on the 62 completed surveys. The total percentage column shown on the left hand side of the table is the sum of total use and does not include never and not completed responses. Local streets for exercise are the most commonly and frequently used type of open space by Thomastown respondents. While the total use is sightly lower than the Municipal average, 40 per cent of Thomastown respondents use local streets for exercise daily, which is 11 per cent higher than the Municipal average. 68 per cent of Thomastown respondents also utilise small local parks with 21 per cent of respondents using them at least once a week.

65 per cent of respondents use urban squares and 61 per cent use sporting reserves. These are 18 and 14 per cent above the Municipal average respectively. 53 per cent of respondents visit major regional parklands, 19 per

cent less than the overall Municipality. At 56 per cent, Edgars Creek is used more frequently in Thomastown when compared to the Municipal average of 22 per cent.


In terms of the most frequently used open space, local streets for exercise is the most popular followed by small local parks and the third being Edgars Creek. The use of sporting reserves and urban squares is significantly higher than the Municipal average.

3.9.6 Facilities and features in open space

3.9.6a Use of facilities and features in open space

The following table indicates use of facilities in open space over the last twelve months. The percentages are calculated on the number of returned surveys from Thomastown, 62.

- Thomastown respondents indicated walking paths are the most popular facility used in the last twelve months being used by 92 per cent of respondents, 10 per cent more than the overall Municipal average.
- Thomastown respondents use open grassed areas for informal use 17 per cent less than the Municipal average.
- At 55 per cent, a higher percentage of Thomastown respondents do not use club based indoor and outdoor recreation facilities when compared to the Municipal average of 42 and 38 per cent respectively.



3.9.6b Provision of facilities in open space


The following graph illustrates the percentage of respondents that consider the various facilities within open space either are or are not adequately provided for. Percentages are calculated on the total number of Thomastown surveys received, 62.

Interpretation of these results indicates that there is scope to improve facility provision in open space to encourage greater use. This includes the following facilities in priority order where 20 per cent or more responded they are not well provided for:

- Public toilets
- Drinking fountains
- Picnic tables
- Shelters
- · Walking paths and seats
- Barbecues
- Playgrounds
- · Fitness equipment and cafe/kiosk

A summary of other comments on the graph includes:


- 42 per cent of respondents were not satisfied with the provision of public toilets in Thomastown, 12 per cent above the Municipal average.
- Approximately 10 per cent of Thomastown respondents consider picnic tables, drinking fountains, and shelters to be less well provided for compared with the Municipal average.



3.9.6c Maintenance of facilities in open space

- Only 31 per cent of respondents consider playgrounds as well maintained, 13 per cent below the Municipal average.
- Only 31 per cent of survey respondents consider open grassed areas for informal use to be well maintained, 18 per cent below the Municipal average.
- Public toilets, shelters, picnic tables, and drinking fountains were considered less well maintained in Thomastown, approximately 10 per cent below the Municipal average.

3.10 Whittlesea

Number of respondents

48 respondents indicated they live in Whittlesea. This represents 8 per cent of the total surveys received. Census figures indicate that 3 per cent of the City of Whittlesea population live in Whittlesea.

3.10.1 Values of open space

Respondents were asked to indicate what they valued most about the open spaces in their municipality and were invited to select any of the twenty-three values listed, with an option to add additional values under the 'other' category.

Percentages are calculated on the basis of the total number of returned surveys for Whittlesea, 48. The table below illustrates the information, listing the twenty-three values in priority order.

69 per cent of respondents consider the opportunity to relax and unwind as the most valued feature of open space, 3 per cent lower than the Municipal average. This is followed by 65 per cent of respondents who value trees 3 per cent above the Municipal average. Over 54 per cent of Whittlesea respondents consider open space important as a place for kids to play, however this is almost 10 per cent lower than the Municipal average. Whittlesea respondents value open space for natural bushland character and as a quiet place 9 per cent above the Municipal average. Open space to escape from traffic and noise, and for playing sport were less valued, being 14 per cent below the Municipal average.


Part 2 – the reasons they are unable to visit open space.

Part 3 – specific open spaces they are unable to visit.



3.10.4a Is there open space you would like to visit but are unable to?

33 per cent of respondents indicated that they would like to visit open space but are unable to. This is consistent with the Municipal average of 32 per cent.

Reasons Whittlesea respondents do not visit open space

The most frequent reasons for not visiting open space were travel distance and lack of time at 50 per cent. Whittlesea respondents were concerned with travel

distance 9 per cent more than the Municipal average and concerned with lack of time 2 per cent more. Only 13 per cent of Whittlesea respondents selected personal safety concerns as a reason for not visiting open space in Whittlesea, 16 per cent below the Municipal average. No respondents selected open space being uninviting as a reason. The remaining reasons for not visiting open space were 9 to 10 per cent below the Municipal average.

44 per cent of Whittlesea respondents selected the 'other' category and listed other reasons they don't visit open space generally, or a specific open space. These included lack of information/knowledge (4), access - closed (1), busy traffic so difficult to access (1), lack of shade/tress (1), and lack of waterway maintenance (1)

3.10.4c Specific open spaces that you would like to visit but are unable to:

33 per cent of Whittlesea respondents said they would like to visit open space but are unable to. 23 per cent indicate they don't visit open space in general, while 4 per cent indicate they don't visit a specific open space.

The specific open spaces not visited by respondents were Barry Road Park (1), Plenty Gorge Park (1), and Yan Yean Reservoir Park (1).

3.10.5 Types of open space visited and frequency of use

Small local parks are the most frequently used type of open space by Whittlesea respondents at 88 per cent. This is 8 per cent higher than the Municipal average. 83 per cent of Whittlesea respondents utilise major regional parklands, with 63 per cent of respondents visiting them 1 to 2 times a year. This is an increase of 10 per cent on the Municipal average. Local streets for exercise are the most frequently used on a daily basis, however the overall use average was 6 per cent lower than the Municipal average.

42 per cent of Whittlesea respondents use Plenty River, which is a 7 per cent increase compared with the Municipal average. Large parks and gardens were used less in Whittlesea, 22 per cent less the Municipal average. The Merri Creek and Darebin Creek were also used less in Whittlesea, over 10 per cent below the Municipal average.



3.10.6a Use of facilities and features in open space

The following table indicates use of facilities in open space over the last twelve months. The percentages are calculated on the number of returned surveys from Whittlesea, 42.

- 65 per cent of Whittlesea respondents indicated they used public toilets, 16 per cent above the Municipal average.
- Use of club-based outdoor sport and recreation facilities was also higher in Whittlesea compared with the Municipal average.
- Use of fitness equipment, informal outdoor sport and recreation facilities, walking paths, cycle paths, playgrounds, BBQs and shelters were all slightly lower than the Municipal average.



3.10.6b Provision of facilities in open space


The following graph illustrates the percentage of respondents that consider the various facilities within open space either are or are not adequately provided for. Percentages are calculated on the total number of Whittlesea surveys received, 42.

Interpretation of these results indicates that there is scope to improve facility provision in open space to encourage greater use. This includes the following facilities in priority order where 20 per cent or more responded they are not well provided for:

- · Public toilets
- Walking paths
- · Picnic tables
- Drinking fountains and seats
- Cycle paths

A summary of other comments on the graph includes:

- Open grassed areas for informal use are considered the best provided for facility in Whittlesea by 38 per cent of respondents, consistent with the Municipal average.
- Only 21 per cent of respondents that used walking paths indicated these were well provided for, 18 per cent below the Municipal average.
- 38 per cent of Whittlesea respondents indicated that public toilets are not well provided for, 8 per cent above the Municipal average.
- Approximately 10 per cent more respondents consider club-based outdoor sport and recreation facilities and cafe/kiosk well provided for when compared with the Municipal average.




Are there enough of these facilites in open space?

- Whittlesea respondents are generally more satisfied with the level of maintenance of facilities in open space, compared with the Municipal average.
- Compared to the Municipal average, 18 per cent more Whittlesea respondents are satisfied with the maintenance level of public toilets.

Appendix C

Assumptions made during the data entry process

The responses to the survey were entered into a relational Microsoft Access database and are summarised on a municipality-wide basis in this report. This information will inform the development of the Whittlesea Open Space Strategy. The relational database allows analysis of the survey data on a more detailed level as required during the Strategy. For example, surveys completed by specific age groups or from specific cultural backgrounds can be queried separately if this is required. The data will also be queried and analysed on a suburb or precinct basis to inform the more detailed analysis process that will occur in the next stage of the project.

The following is a summary of some of the assumptions made in entering the data from the surveys into the database.

- Some respondents did not provide the name of the open space they visited, instead listing the name of surrounding streets or buildings/landmarks that were used to help identify the park or reserve they were referring to. If this occurred, the following method was used:
 - If the open space could be identified using the street names or buildings/landmarks provided and was located within the municipality, the response would be attributed to the appropriate open space.
 - If the open space was identified but located outside the municipality and was not one of the nearby open spaces in adjoining municipalities, the response was placed into the category of 'Other open space' and information about its use was documented accordingly.
 - If the open space was identified but located outside the municipality and was one of the nearby open spaces in adjoining municipalities the response was placed into the category of 'Other open space outside the municipality' and information was documented accordingly.
 - If the open space visited was not included at all, i.e. the field left blank, it was recorded as 'Not completed'. Information about its use and suggested improvements were documented accordingly.
 - If the open space visited was unable to be identified or outside of the municipality, it
 was placed in the category of 'Other open space' and information about its use was
 documented accordingly.
 - Shopping plazas (e.g. Lalor Shopping Centre), local school grounds, adjoining properties and other types of space not covered in the strategy were placed in the category as 'Ancillary open space'. Information about its use and suggested improvements were documented accordingly.
- Darebin Creek was used where people referred to Darebin Creek Parklands and Darebin Creek Trail.
- When respondents included comments in relation to a specific open space in the 'General Comments' section, this information was entered into the specific open space in the question regarding local open space visited, rather than in the General Comments Section.

- When respondents used question marks in the Facilities Section of the questionnaire, they
 were not recorded and were counted as not completed. All other forms of marking boxes
 were recorded.
- When respondents provided suggested improvements as a response to the question 'reasons why you visit [open space]', these were entered as suggested improvements and not as reasons for visiting.
- When respondents provided a specific open space as a response to the question 'reasons why you visit [open space]', these were entered as open space visited.
- When respondents included a written submission with the survey leaflet, any responses to survey questions were recorded, and the survey was then processed as a written submission.
