

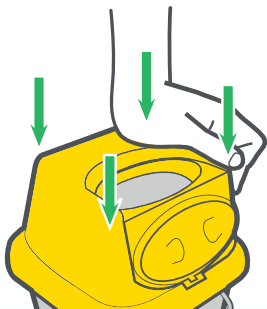
# Why Is Sharp Safety at Home So Important?

## Tips for Safe Sharps Disposal

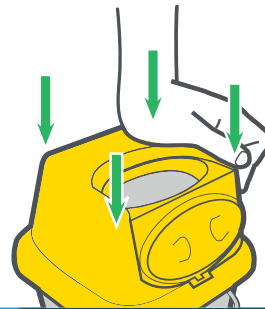
### Double-Check the Lid

Ensure your bin is securely closed at all four corners. This small step prevents accidents and keeps the contents contained.



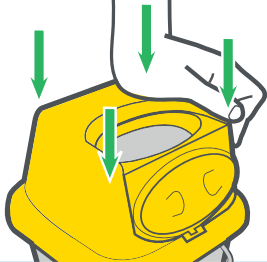
### Pick a Safe Spot

Store your sharps bin in a stable, out-of-reach location like a locked cabinet or a high shelf to keep children and pets safe.



### Secure the Base

Use the built-in double-sided tape to keep your bin steady, reducing the risk of it tipping over during use. If you need to secure the container, base stands are available to reduce the risk of accidental tipping.



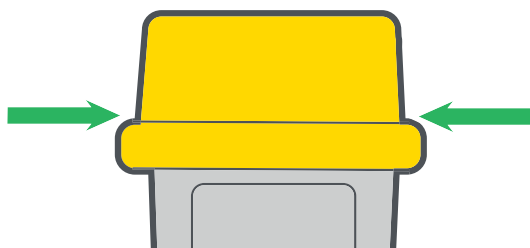
### Single-Handed Convenience

You only need one hand to open and close your Sharpsafe bin, making it safer and easier to dispose of needles without added risk.



### Don't Overfill

Never fill your bin above the marked line. Overfilled bins are a hazard, increasing the risk of accidental needlestick injuries.



### Seal and Dispose Properly

Once your container is full, use the permanent closure feature and drop the entire bin into your nearest council-approved disposal unit.
