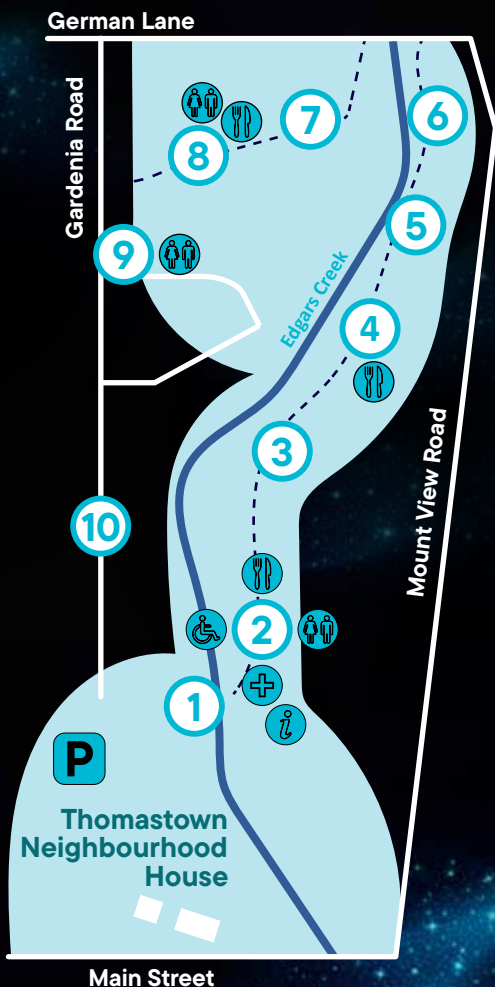


WALKING THOMASTOWN
